INTRODUCTION

There is still much to discover about the origins of our family, but I have chosen to put into print what has been gathered up to now, and to let younger relatives try to fill in the missing generation[s] which first came to this country.

Data on current family members was provided by someone in that branch of the family. Wherever pictures or documents were sent to me, I have tried to include them. [Those not used did not copy well.]

Much information from a century ago, especially of a personal and often trivial nature, was obtained from reading newspapers published in or near Lawrence County, Illinois, which are available on microfilm from the Illinois State Historical Library in Springfield. Principal sources were "The Sumner Press" in Sumner and the "Rural Republican" in Lawrenceville [both in Lawrence County].

Issues before 1885 were rarely available, and even after that, many individual issues and in some cases, whole years were missing. [Sumner Press had nothing for 1893 or 1899] In general, the newspapers covered the time from 1885 until 1912.

United States Census records were searched, and all those found were recorded here. [The 1890 Census is missing because it was accidentally destroyed by fire many years ago.] Where possible, a copy of the Census was made. However, some pages were in very bad condition, making copies unreadable.

The spelling of some names varied from source to source [i.e. Waggy or Waggy, Corbin or Corban]. My rule has been that I usually use the same spelling that my source material used, which can mean different spellings on the same page.

Some pages in this book have a border around them. This indicates that the enclosed data is about the family of an IRWIN in-law. Where possible, these have been placed on the left-hand side, so they can be read separately or concurrently with the IRWIN story.

I have tried to avoid errors, and ask pardon for those that escaped the editing process.

JOHN and ALICE IRWIN

John P. IRWIN was born in Petty Township, Lawrence County, Illinois on July 15, 1862. He was the second child of William and Sarah Irwin. He was eight years old when his father died. He worked as a farm hand on the family farm, and then for several neighboring farmers. In 1881 (age 19), he and his young brother, Harvey (13), went to Iowa, where they apparently found employment and spent almost a year.

25 May 1882: John and Harvey IRWIN went to Iowa last fall.
They are making it pay.¹

John may have lived in Lawrenceville for a while, according to these items in the Rural Republican newspaper.²

6 Nov 1885: Mr. Harve IRWIN is visiting his brother here
[Lawrenceville].

4 Dec 1885: Mr John Irwin and brother are visiting their brother,
Mr. Jim IRWIN, this week in Birds.

There is no information about how they met or their courtship, but John married [Mary] Alice LACKEY on the 7th of December, 1887 in Vincennes, Indiana, just across the Wabash River from Lawrenceville. [See LACKEY FAMILY].

8 Dec 1887: John IRWIN and Miss Alice LACKEY were married
at Vincennes yesterday.³

In September 1888, they moved to Lewiston, Illinois, [probably 'Lewistown' in Fulton county].

6 Sep 1888: J. P. IRWIN will move this week to Lewiston,
Illinois to work for John WAGY in the marble business.⁴

John Campbell WAGY II was a cousin, a son of the Rev. William WAGY. John had a marble business, consisting primarily of carving tombstones. John IRWIN remained associated with carving or selling marble for the rest of his life.

LACKEY - WADE

Mary Alice LACKEY was the daughter of William A. LACKEY and Odean J. WADE. She was born in Kentucky in November, 1867.

The family was living in Fox Town precinct, Madison County, Kentucky when the 1870 Census was taken.¹

Mary Alice LACKEY married John IRWIN on the 7th of December, 1887 in Vincennes, Indiana. She would have been just 20 years old, but gave her age as 23 on the marriage license.* [See JOHN and ALICE] *[Knox County, Indiana, Marriage Record, page 257]

No other information has been found on this family.

John and Alice had two sons, Melvin and Alvin, both of whom were born probably in Fulton County, IL. Sometime during the next few years, they moved to Paxton, in Ford County Illinois, where John opened his own shop. This must have kept him very busy, because he didn't get back to visit Lawrence County for many years.

In the 1900 Census, they were listed on Elm Street in Paxton.¹ John and Mary Alice had been married for 13 years. Melvin was only 10 at that time, not 12.

In the 1910 Census, they were still in Paxton, with both sons. At that time, Melvin was 21 and Alvin was 18.²

In 1912, John decided to move west, near his brother, Harvey, and cousin, Ott, but first they made a visit to Lawrence County. The newspaper reported:

John IRWIN and wife of Paxton, Illinois, are here visiting relatives and friends. This is their first visit here in twenty years.³

J. P. Irwin, who has been visiting here, left for Paxton, where he will close up his marble business before going to Okanogan, Washington, where he will locate his future home."⁴

During the next few years the family moved from Okanogan to Spokane, Washington. The 1920 Census⁵ found John, Alice and Alvin living in a hotel at West 906 Second Ave, in Spokane. John was a salesman at that time and Alvin a laborer, both for the Washington Monument Company.

John died in Spokane on August 24, 1923, at age 61. The cause of death was prostate cancer.⁶ He was buried in Greenwood Memorial Terrace Cemetery in Spokane. Alice is listed in Spokane City directories through 1938, usually with Alvin. She died in Wenatchee, Washington in 1938.⁷

MELVIN

Melvin Lackey IRWIN was born in November 1889, in Lewiston or Lewistown, Illinois. His family moved to Paxton, in Ford County, when he was very young. He was 23 years old when his parents moved to Washington State. It isn't known exactly when he moved west, or when he married, but by 1915, he had a wife and child in Washington State.

Marian CALLAHAN, who married Melvin, was born in Illinois in January, 1894. In 1900, her family was living in Loda, Iroquois County, Illinois - only about five miles from Paxton. She had one sister and one brother.¹

Melvin and Marian were living in Okanogan, Washington when their first child, Scott Wade, was born on the 15th of May, 1915. They then moved to Spokane, where their second child, William Owen, was born on October 24th, 1919. The 1920 Census found them in Spokane with their two children, and renting at 1708 Sixth Ave, Spokane.² Melvin, like his father, was a salesman for the Washington Monument Company. He was 31 at that time, Marian was 25, Scottie was 4 1/2 and William was 3 months old.

Melvin and Marian were still in Spokane in 1925, living at W 1323 2nd Avenue.³ Soon thereafter, they moved back to Chicago, Illinois. Melvin died in Chicago on February 8th, 1945 at the age of 55. Marian died three years later, on January 12th, 1948 in Corvallis, Oregon.

ALVIN

Alvin never married. His mother lived with him until about 1938, and for the next few years, he is listed alone in Spokane City directories, always in small apartment-hotels near the center of town. The most recent address found [in 1943] was S. 206 Post, Spokane. Alvin died in Wenatchee on March 21st, 1961 at the age of 68 [according to Washington State death records].⁴

John's family was living in Ford County, Illinois, in the town of Paxton in 1910. The above index indicates that they were in Enumeration District 10, and were the 130th household listed in that E.D. John's age was given as 46, Mary Alice as 41 and the sons as 21 and 18.

[The microfilm of the Census record itself was very difficult to read and impossible to copy. It is not surprising that Alvin's name was misread as "Albin" in the index.]
