## INTRODUCTION

There is still much to discover about the origins of our family, but I have chosen to put into print what has been gathered up to now, and to let younger relatives try to fill in the missing generation[s] which first came to this country.

Data on current family members was provided by someone in that branch of the family. Wherever pictures or documents were sent to me, I have tried to include them. [Those not used did not copy well.]

Much information from a century ago, especially of a personal and often trivial nature, was obtained from reading newspapers published in or near Lawrence County, Illinois, which are available on microfilm from the Illinois State Historical Library in Springfield. Principal sources were "The Sumner Press" in Sumner and the "Rural Republican" in Lawrenceville [both in Lawrence County].

Issues before 1885 were rarely available, and even after that, many individual issues and in some cases, whole years were missing. [Sumner Press had nothing for 1893 or 1899] In general, the newspapers covered the time from 1885 until 1912.

United States Census records were searched, and all those found were recorded here. [The 1890 Census is missing because it was accidentally destroyed by fire many years ago.] Where possible, a copy of the Census was made. However, some pages were in very bad condition, making copies unreadable.

The spelling of some names varied from source to source [i.e. Waggy or Waggy, Corbin or Corban]. My rule has been that I usually use the same spelling that my source material used, which can mean different spellings on the same page.

Some pages in this book have a border around them. This indicates that the enclosed data is about the family of an IRWIN in-law. Where possible, these have been placed on the left-hand side, so they can be read separately or concurrently with the IRWIN story.

I have tried to avoid errors, and ask pardon for those that escaped the editing process.

## ETTA and GEORGE GILLESPIE

Etta Jane IRWIN was born in April, 1870, in Petty Township, Lawrence County, Illinois, the fifth child and only daughter of William and Sarah IRWIN. Her father died shortly before her first birthday. She was about 15 when her mother also died. After that, she lived off and on with her oldest brother, James [who lived in Birds], and with other relatives and friends. One can't tell if she felt at home everywhere, or perhaps nowhere.

Following are some excerpts from a local newspaper, The Sumner Press,<sup>1</sup> from 1886 through 1890 [when Etta was 16 to 20 years of age].

- 02 Dec 1886: Miss Etta IRWIN of Birds is visiting in Pasturefield.  
[This is where Mary Irwin, her grandmother, lived.]
- 14 Apr 1887: Miss Etta IRWIN, who has been staying at Robinson for the past two weeks, has returned to Birds.
- 25 Oct 1888: Miss Etta IRWIN, who now lives in Pasturefield, is making quite a lengthy visit with friends at Birds.
- 01 Nov 1888: Miss Etta IRWIN, one of our most charming belles, has returned to Pasturefield to stay with Mrs. BARNES.  
[Mrs BARNES was Mary IRWIN's nearest neighbor and friend].
- 13 Dec 1888: Miss Etta IRWIN, one of our most charming young ladies, left last Tuesday for Lewiston, Illinois, where she will work at the dressmaking and millinery trade.
- 17 Jan 1889: Miss Etta IRWIN is making dresses for the pretty young ladies of Lewiston, Illinois. She is living with her brother [John] there.
- 10 Oct 1889: Miss Etta IRWIN started for Flat Rock last Tuesday to visit her brother, James.
- 20 Feb 1890: Miss Etta IRWIN ... arrived [in Pasturefield] from Flat Rock last Friday to care for Harvey IRWIN, who is a victim of pneumonia. She will remain during her brother's illness.
- 10 Apr 1890: Miss Etta IRWIN left Pasturefield last Saturday for Birds, where she will canvass for a book.
- 16 Oct 1890: Miss Etta IRWIN returned to Birds after a week's visit with relatives and friends here [in Pasturefield]. From thence, she will go to Chicago where she intends to make her future home.

## GILLESPIE - BARNHART FAMILY

Mary Elizabeth BARNHART was born in Maryland in March, 1846. Her mother, Margaret [maiden name unknown] was born in Pennsylvania in February, 1824, the daughter of two native Pennsylvanians.<sup>1</sup> Margaret married Mr BARNHART about 1845, and may have been widowed about 1850. In 1853, Margaret married Theophilus CONNER, by whom she had six more children: Charles, Martha, Thomas, Ellen, Harvey and Roanna.

In the 1870 Census, Theophilus and Margaret were listed with their four youngest children in Pittsburgh.<sup>2</sup>

Mary Elizabeth BARNHART married George Watt GILLESPIE about 1870. [He was born in August 1844 in Pennsylvania. Both his parents were from Ireland.] George and Mary had three sons born in Pittsburgh: Charles Arthur, 8 August 1871<sup>3</sup> George Bell, 16 February 1874<sup>4</sup>; and Harvey Thompson, 15 July 1876<sup>5</sup>

In 1880, Mary and her sons were living with the CONNERS at the time of the Census.<sup>6</sup>

Mr. GILLESPIE may have been away looking for work in 1880, as he moved his family to Chicago shortly thereafter. A fourth son, David Watt, was born to them in Chicago in 1885.

At this time, nothing is known of her life in Chicago until 1895, when she married George Bell GILLESPIE. Their first child, Marian Etta, was born in Chicago on the 5th of August 1896. The 1900 Census found them living at 520 Stevenson St, Hyde Park Township, Chicago.<sup>1</sup> George was working as a house painter. Their home was very near that of Etta's brother, Jim IRWIN, with whom she may have been living before her marriage.

[Note:] Etta was born in 1870, and would have been 30 at this time.]

Etta and George moved to Colorado some time after that, and their second child, Harvey Irwin GILLESPIE, was born in Denver on 29 November 1903. From there, the family moved to Washington State where their third child, Marjorie Grace, was born in 1907.

When the 1920 Census was taken, Etta had been divorced from George, and was living in an apartment at 2021 4th Ave North in Seattle.<sup>2</sup> With her were Harvey [17] and Marjorie [13]. Her occupation was housekeeper for the apartment building. Harvey was working as a salesman in a paint store. Marian had married by this time, and was with her husband's family.

During the 1930s, Etta and all her family moved to Hollywood, California. She took a job caring for two boys, Tommy and Skippy, who became like family to her.

Etta wrote many letters back to the Seattle family, especially to Belle IRWIN, her sister-in-law, and Blanche IRWIN, her niece, keeping them informed about the California relations. Another of her Seattle correspondents was Bobby MOLLOY, her brother Harvey's grandson. During the six months that Bobby was ill with leukemia, the letters from "Aunt Etta" to her "Little Lamb" were sent often and looked forward to eagerly.

Etta died on the 27th of November, 1958 in Hollywood at the age of 88, after an illness of three years. [George, her former husband, died in 1948.]

In 1900, the CONNERS were still in Pittsburgh, on Berlin Alley, living with four adult children and two grandchildren.<sup>1</sup>

The GILLESPIEs were still in Chicago, living on 104th Street in Hyde Park Township.<sup>2</sup> Three of their sons were living with them.

## MARIAN

Marian Etta, the oldest child of Etta and George GILLESPIE, was born in Chicago on the 5th of August, 1896. Her family moved to Colorado and then to Washington State while she was still a child. In about 1917, she married James Samuel IRVINE in Seattle.

James Samuel IRVINE was born in Philadelphia about 1891, the son of Scottish immigrants. His father, Samuel IRVINE came to the U.S. in 1882, and his mother, Margaret, in 1883. They moved to Washington State from Pennsylvania when James was a baby, and their second child, Marguerite, was born in Seattle in 1894. Both parents became citizens in 1897.

In 1920, Jim and Marian were living with his family at 519 E. Denny Way in Seattle.<sup>1</sup> James was working as a grocery salesman at that time. Their son, who was called "Junior" for many years, was 16 months old.

Near midnight New Year's Eve in 1927, Marian presented her husband with twins: Robert Gillespie and Marjorie Jean. They were almost born in different years.

During the 1930s, Marian and James moved to Hollywood, California, where they lived at 414 Westbourne Drive. James IRVINE died there in 1937. Marian remained in Hollywood for many years before moving to Hemet, CA, [near two of her children] where she died on the 28th of January 1985 at the age of 89.

## HARVEY

Harvey Irwin GILLESPIE was born on the 29th of November, 1903 in Denver, Colorado. He was raised in Seattle, Washington. He moved to California probably about the time that his mother did. He married Laura [maiden name not known]. They had no children. Harvey died on December 2nd, 1970 in Santa Monica, CA at the age of 67.

## MARJORIE

Marjorie Grace GILLESPIE was born in Washington in 1907. She moved to California and worked for many years as an X-ray technician. She was married during the 1940s to Fred BRAUER (spelling of surname not known). After his death, she married a dentist, 'Doc' Francis GUYTON. They lived at 4424 Mariota Avenue in North Hollywood. She had no children. Marjorie Grace died in 1970 in Los Angeles.

Excerpts from a letter Etta wrote to Blanche IRWIN:

Nov 15 (1944)

Dear Blanche and the rest of the family,

I still say you are a jewel to write. I wonder if your father will get the letter finished he started to write before last Christmas. It had better be a long one. I was so glad to hear from you and get those pictures, I just sat down and had a nice visit with every one of you. I agree with you on the election. I say by another 4 yrs there won't need to be an election. Just put a crown on him.

I guess you know Jr [IRVINE] is in the navy. We think he is in Guam. We have had two letters from him, but the last one said he was still on the water. I was surprised to see Billie [MOLLOY] in uniform. It doesn't seem possible he is old enough. He makes a fine looking soldier. I hope he will never have to leave the States, but I suppose he is like all the rest - anxious to get into it. My two boys, Skippy and Tommy, are down in the Pacific. They were paratroopers down on one of the islands, but found they couldn't use them there and sent them home to train for the amphibious. But Tommy got married before he left and Skippy is engaged. There was a party to announce his engagement before he left. It will be a strange Xmas without our boy.

Marion is working and Bobby and Marjorie [IRVINE] are working after school, and I am nursemaid to the two dogs and have dinner ready when they get home. My Marjorie [GILLESPIE] is an X-ray technician and working in Hollywood. Times up. Lots of love to all.

Excerpts from a letter to Belle IRWIN -

414 Westbourne Dr, L.A.

May 12, 1948

...The children gave me quite a little party, some nice gifts, and Mothers Day coming so close, I have really been remembered. Mothers Day makes us really thankful to be a mother. I am sure with your children and grandchildren around you, you felt the same way.

...Just at the present Jimmie and his wife are living with us as they can't find a place to live. So Marion is sharing my room, gave hers up to them.

...Harvey and Laura are on the last lap of their way home, I think, for I haven't had a card for about four days. They have been down in Tenn and Georgia, then up to Chicago and Minnesota to see Laura's people. They were going to call on Raymond [IRWIN] in Chicago. What news they will have for me. I haven't seen Raymond since he was married, and he writes me he is soon to be a grandfather. He has two boys, one married and the other in college. He said his mother lives in Miami, Florida, and has a five room bungalow almost in the heart of the city.

...I am sure Howard's baby [David IRWIN] must be cute. How I would love to see it - in fact all of you.

...Marjorie and Fred haven't got their house built yet. They have the sewer pipes laid, but it takes time to get a permit and material, but they live in hopes. It is almost impossible to find a place to rent here, and rents are so high.... I don't believe property will ever be cheap again. They say they are coming in to Calif. by the hundreds every day, so of course they have to have a place to live. Some are living in one room, others in trailer camps and motels. So we are very thankful to have a roof over our heads. ...

Marjorie Jean and her husband are coming to dinner tonight. We are going to have spaghetti. Marian is going to visit Seattle in June or July on her vacation, so you will see her. If I was able to travel I would go along, but I am too lame...

Oceans of love to all my people.

Raymond's hair is as white as snow. He has a lovely wife. She is pretty and so much fun, I suppose they are very happy.
