Martha Jane MCNEW was born on 3 August 1856 in Booneville, Owsley County, Kentucky, the sixth child and fourth daughter of Moses and Clarissa. She was not yet four years of age when her father died.

Martha was sixteen when the family moved to Harlan County, Nebraska. Soon thereafter, Martha met Eli EWELL, the son of a neighbor. They were married in Harlan County in 1875 when Martha was about 19 and Eli was 27. (Eli was born in Michigan on the 4th of March, 1848 to Libbius and Eliza EWELL.) The young couple moved to California for a time, and their first child, William, was born there in February 1877.

They had returned to Nebraska by the time their second child, Hester Maud, was born in September 1878. The 1880 Census shows Martha and Eli with their two children, living in the Spring Creek area of Harlan County, next to her Uncle Joseph's and very near Eli's parents and Clarissa.

A third child, Fred, was born to them in October, 1881. In 1882, along with most of the MCNEW clan, they left Nebraska by covered wagon for Washington Territory, eventually settling in Lincoln County north of the town of Davenport. A fourth child, Josephine, was born in Lincoln County in April 1885, followed ten years later by another daughter, Olive, in 1895.² Martha had four other children who died at or soon after birth. They were born probably between Josephine and Olive.

In 1885, there was a census taken by the Washington Territorial government in many counties. The Eli Ewell family is listed in Lincoln County, along with another Ewell, probably a brother, although not born in the same state.³

The 1900 Census shows most of the family still living in the Larene area of Lincoln County.¹ It was from this we learned that Martha had nine children, only five of whom survived. The oldest son, William, had left home and was working in Ferry county at this time.

Sometime after 1900, Martha and Eli separated and eventually divorced. Olive remembered being put in a boarding school for a while, presumably to remove her from the domestic discord. Martha later married Martin VAN DER LUGT, who was called "The Old Dutchman" by her children. He died some time before the 1920 Census, which shows Martha as a widow, living with Olive's family in Seattle.²



(Hester) Maud Ewell was born in Nebraska in September 1878, and taken to Washington Territory when she was about 4 years old. The 1900 Census shows her at age 21 living with her parents.¹

She married Howard WILLIAMS, and lived in Stites, Idaho (SE of Lewiston) for the rest of her life. They had no children.

FRED LIBBIUS EWELL

Fred Libbius EWELL was born 26 October 1881 in Kearney, NE. (It is likely that he was born in Spring Creek and the birth was registered in Kearney.) He was very young when his parents moved to Washington Territory.

He was first married to Ida GALLOWAY, and as far as we know, they had no children. She died 26 May 1921. On 21 November 1921, he married a neighboring widow, (Altha) Pearl CARSON, who had three sons, Jack, Charles and Henry. (Pearl was born on the 31st of October, 1884 in Butler, Montana). Fred and Pearl had three more children (all daughters), and Fred adopted Henry, Pearl's youngest son.

In the 1920 Census¹, Fred gave his occupation as electrician for the Spokane street railway. It is believed that the daughter listed was Ida's from a previous marriage.

Fred and his family moved to wherever he could find work. In the late 1920s, they lived in Orofino, Idaho while he helped build a railraod. They spent several years in Seattle in the early 1930s, and then moved to Coulee City, where he did construction work on the Dam and on surrounding projects. They remained there until Pearl's death.

Pearl died 26 April 1965 in Ephrata, Washington. Fred then moved to Spokane where he died less than a year later, on 14 January 1966.

(fd) JOSEPHINE MABEL EWELL BURKE MATCHETTE

Josephine Mabel (Joe) was born in Lincoln County, Washington Territory, on 25 April, 1885.

As a young woman, she moved to Montana, and worked as a cashier in a restaurant. Some time later, she married the owner, John BURKE (who was wealthy and much older than she) and moved to Los Angeles, California. They had no children.

They were living in Los Angeles when the 1920 Census was taken.¹

In 1928, Joe's brother-in-law, Frank Matchette, arrived from Seattle with his two daughters, Virginia and Dorothy, and they all stayed with the Burkes several months while Frank looked for a house. Joe and John wanted to adopt Dorothy, then three years old, but Frank wouldn't hear of it.

John BURKE died in the early 1930's, presumably much less well off than he had been before the depression.

Joe then supported herself by opening a catering and gourmet take-out food service with a friend, Addie BARKER. "BURKE and BARKER" was noted for its excellent quality food, and was very successful during the late 30's and early 40's.

In 1939, when Dorothy became a teenager, she went to live with Joe. Dorothy's father would visit every week-end. Eventually, Frank turned his attention from his daughter to her aunt, and he and Josephine were married on the 2nd of May, 1942 in Los Angeles. (He would sometimes jokingly say that he should marry Maud WILLIAMS next as she was the only sister left that he hadn't wed.)

Joe is described as slim, dark-haired, of medium height and a very hard worker. She was full of fun.

Josephine died in Los Angeles in 1960. Frank later married again and moved to Mentor, Ohio, where he died in May, 1976.

(fe) OLIVE MAE EWELL MATCHETTE LUNDBERG

Olive Mae was born in Lincoln County, Washington State, on 12 April 1895, the youngest of the five Ewell children. During her childhood, her parents were separated and then divorced. Olive spent part of this time in a boarding school, an unhappy experience for her.

Olive's first husband was Francis Cecil MATCHETTE (born 19 June 1893 in Iron county, Wisconsin). They were married ll November, 1913, probably in Spokane. There is a family story that when their first child, Virginia, was being born in their Spokane home in the winter of 1915, Frank fainted. He was promptly thrown out into the snow by Martha, Olive's mother, who was assisting with the birth, and wanted to keep him out of the way.

Olive and Frank moved to Seattle before 1920, and their second child, Dorothy, was born there in 1925. They took in a boarder, a Danish immigrant who worked with Frank, to help with expenses. He was a friendly, agreeable fellow who used to help Olive with the dishes in the evening. In November, 1927, Olive and the boarder, Louis LUNDBERG, ran off together. Frank tried to talk her into coming back to him, but to no avail. Olive obtained a divorce, and married Louis.

Frank took their two daughters to California, where they all stayed with Olive's sister, Joe, temporarily. This move was particularly hard on the older girl, Virginia, who was 13 at that time, and very close to her mother. After six months of homesickness, it was arranged that she would go back to Seattle to live with Olive. The younger daughter, Dorothy, stayed with her father, who had found them a home and hired a housekeeper so they could be together. Olive remained very close to Virginia all her life, but rarely saw Dorothy, who remained in California.

Olive loved pretty things, and always dressed beautifully. She and Louis both loved to travel, and there were not many places on earth which they did not visit. They were on a tour in Denmark in July 1970 when Louis died suddenly.

In her later years, Olive took care of Virginia, who was very ill. They shared an apartment near Broadway in Seattle. Virginia died in the fall of 1984, and Olive followed a few months later on 12 March 1985.




